<b>3. INPATIENT PHARMACY SERVICES</b>					
a. Processes, prepares, and dispenses inpatient and emergency care patient medication orders. Inputs medication orders into CHCS. Produces medication labels. Supervises and performs custom sterile product compounding to include IV piggybacks, fluids, syringes, and total parenteral nutrition for neonatal to geriatric patients.
